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Jasper Claessen (PhD) is coordinating policy advisor at the Department of Pharmaceutical Affairs and Medical Technology at the Dutch Ministry of Health. He works on policies regarding the development of innovative medicines, with a special focus on the synergy between public and private interests in medicine development. As a team coordinator he covers policy work on the pharmaceutical legislation and market entry, as well as wider availability of medicines, and policies on supply chain vulnerabilities and production. Jasper takes a special interest in the Dutch policies aimed to stimulate R&D into novel antimicrobials, and represents the Dutch Ministry of Health in several national and international organizations that aim to tackle the AMR crisis.
